On the first full day of Staff Week 2021, braving unseasonably warm temperatures and high humidity, our entire staff gathered for the first time under the majestic canopy of our new *Merkaz Tarbut*, a cultural center bringing together our visual arts and carpentry programs with a stunning new outdoor performance space. We sat there all masked, having just completed our second cafeteria-style meal

following COVID-19 protocols and learning how to operate most efficiently when the campers arrive.

What happened next is an apt framing for our summers at Ramah Day Camp in Chicagoland and Camp Ramah in Wisconsin, tying together three themes: the opportunity for a special kind of enhanced summer, gratefulness at having reached this moment in our camps' history and in our lives, and a refocusing of our camper experience on a newly refined set of core values. First, we polled the crowd for some favorite "doubles" – among them baseball doubleheaders, Wrigley's Doublemint gum, double popsicles, and the newest one: the double-stuffed Oreo. We then spoke about the unique opportunity we have during this summer to offer each other and our campers **double the fun, double the friends, and double the activities.**

We transitioned into a reminder of how lucky we are to have gotten to this point, to have arrived at camp. Assistant Director Daniella Elyashar reminded us all that the Hebrew word for arrive is *l'hagi'ah*, and a number of staff members recognized that a form of that verb is found in the shehecheyanu blessing we say at important moments of newness and renewal. **This summer is a shehecheyanu summer.**

Next we were led in a series of games and activities that operated on two levels: first, they helped demonstrate for our counselors how they could be brought back to the playfulness of childhood at camp and how to do so within our COVID-19 safety guidelines.

The second level is even more important, as we introduced to them the four core values that serve as guideposts to us as we design and implement life for our campers. These values are **joy, growth, inclusion, and connection.** First and foremost, camp must be joyful; second, campers grow every summer and the intentional nurturing of that growth is a core part of our educational role; third, we strive to be as inclusive and welcoming a community as possible for all our campers and staff, from all their backgrounds and life stories; and, finally, camp is about building connections with peers, counselors, Judaism, and more.

As Staff Week ended, so did our 22-month countdown to camp. The buses rolled in from Buckatabon Road and I know that I was not the only one overcome with emotion. The campers bounded off the buses, overflowing with excitement to finally be back at camp. The 2021 season – our *#ReturnToRamah* – is underway and we will do our absolute best to fill it with double the connection, double the inclusion, double the growth, and – surely – double the joy.

I have never been more excited for the start of camp than I am right now. This includes the summers when I attended as a camper and staff member, as well as more recently when I was sending my kids to camp. Each year, as the weather gets warmer and the school year winds down,

the positive energy for another Ramah summer goes up. But this year, those feelings are heightened due to the loss of our traditional summer programs in Conover and Wheeling last season. The many challenges we have faced during the pandemic have only increased the need and excitement for our return this year.

Part of my excitement comes from knowing how hard our professional staff members have worked to get to this point. Throughout the year, their creativity and ingenuity shined through with the many online programs to keep our campers connected. At the same time, they had to envision what in-person camp would look like this summer. Early on our professionals developed contingency plans for how to operate our camps in an ever-changing environment. Every detail of camp had to be reviewed to make sure we would be in compliance with whatever rules or limitations would be put in place. Our purchasing, logistics and programming had to be reimagined, along with measuring every inch of the cabins and buildings for health and safety measures. No part of the summer experience was left untouched.

My excitement grew after every “Countdown to Camp” program we held for our families on Zoom. These were a critical part of our overall communication plan and an important opportunity to share our evolving preparations. I heard from many individuals that these points of contact, along with many follow-up phone calls, calmed the nerves of both parents and campers. It instilled confidence in our community that we were thinking through every issue and that we would be prepared. Our medical committee, led by Dr. Mark Drexler, was instrumental in guiding us each step of the way.

I am so proud that we have now opened our camps safely, taking into account the physical and emotional health of all of our campers and staff. This accomplishment is incredibly meaningful and I am grateful to all the individuals and organizations that carried us from the beginning of the pandemic to the start of the 2021 camp season. Your commitment to our mission never wavered and only intensified over this past challenging year. This summer’s Ramah experience will once again prove that our product is well worth the investment.

I have always believed that the Ramah partnership with our community is a mutually beneficial one. This idea is depicted in something I learned over Shavuot about the Ark of the Covenant. There is a great deal of mystery and magic (and a good movie, too!) around the Ark that Moses built to house the tablets upon which the Ten Commandments were written. The Levites were given the holy task of carrying this heavy Ark through the desert, river and rough terrain with the Israelites. Yet the Talmud describes that when things were difficult for the Levites, the Ark actually carried them and allowed them to continue on their journey. This image makes me think of the incredible relationship between our camps and our community. Our camps educate and inspire our young people to be fully engaged in their home Jewish communities. Our communities carry and support our camps, especially in difficult times like this past year, to continue our holy work.

This metaphor of the Ark of the Covenant and our camps has a further application. The Talmud describes that the Ark actually contained two sets of tablets - the first set that Moses broke and the second set that remained intact. It may seem odd to keep the first set around since it made the Ark heavier and was a constant reminder of the troublesome episode with the golden calf. But it was part of the Israelites’ history and perhaps an inspiration to them going forward. So too, for us, the continuous chain of providing summer camp experiences was broken last year. We will not forget the time, energy and resources required to get us back to where we are now. While we do not know the long term impact of our lost summer, we are now exceptionally prepared to move forward for this summer and into the future. With the help of our extraordinary community and our amazing professional staff, we are returning to our camp homes stronger and more excited than ever.

A summer of joy, growth and connection -

Our #1 priority has always been the health and safety of the camp community, and this year that priority includes additional protocols and unique components.

Based on established best practices, camping industry guidelines, and medical expertise, Camp Ramah in Wisconsin is following these guidelines to prevent COVID-19 from entering camp and to minimize its spread if it does:

- Vaccination - A COVID-19 vaccine was required for staff members, and encouraged for campers ages 12 and older. (Our camp population includes approximately 150 campers ages 8-11.)
- Testing - All campers and staff, regardless of vaccination status, were required to take two PCR COVID-19 tests prior to arrival day. On the first day, tests were administered at the bus departures or upon arrival at camp, prior to entering the camp bubble. Mask and pod protocols are in effect for the 7-10 day arrival period; assuming everyone tests negative, masks and pods will no longer be required.

After four negative tests over a 17-day period, staff members were allowed to remove their masks for the last days of staff week. They re-masked for the camper arrival.



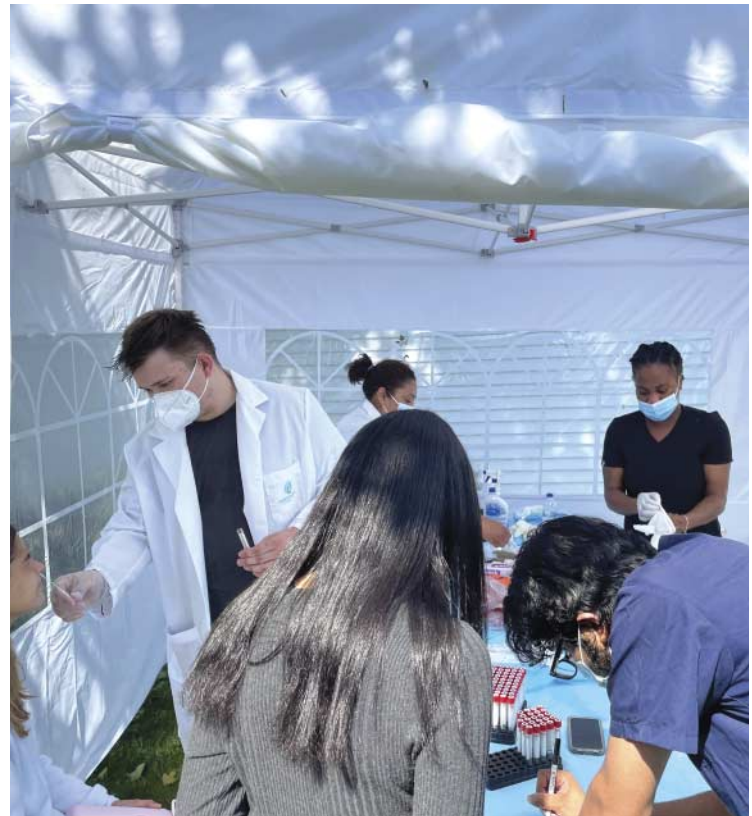
Additional washing stations were added and new picnic tables were built for outdoor eating

Special purchases were made for both camps: COVID-19 testing kits, personal protective equipment (PPE) for medical staff, disposable masks, shields, additional washing stations, hand sanitizer and pumps, and HEPA/UV filters in cabins and buildings. We are particularly grateful to Magid Glove & Safety for expanding their annual support to include much of our PPE needs for this summer.

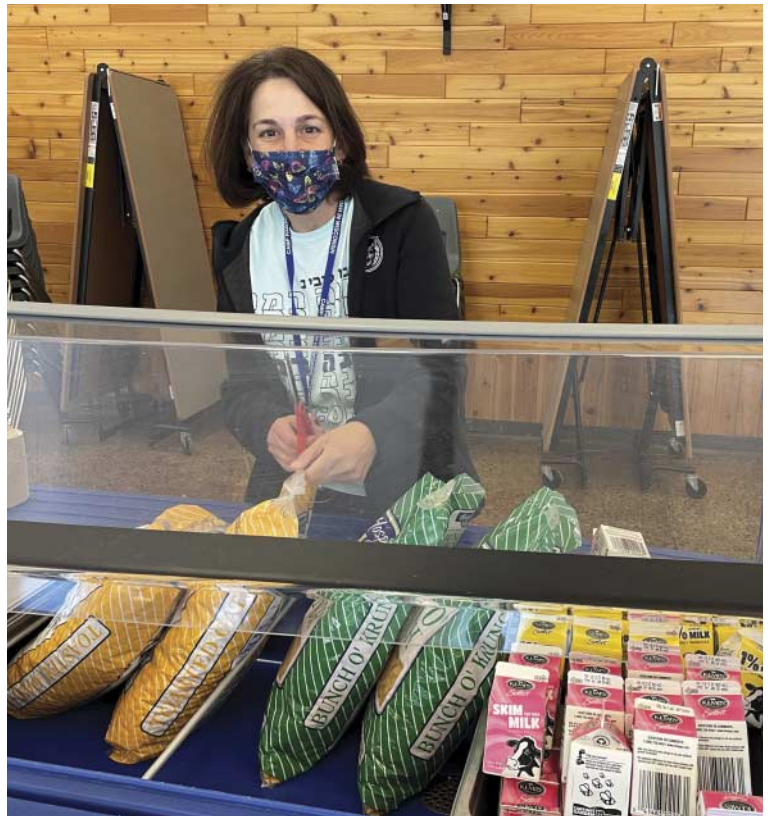


Additional covered outdoor spaces were built for medical use and as program areas

For many years, Camp Ramah in Wisconsin has partnered with *Camp Leaders* to bring European university students to work in our kitchen. Due to COVID-19 it was not an option this year, and we are grateful to camper parents and alumni who stepped up in a big way to help out for one or more weeks.

Enhanced Staff Experience

After 15 months of navigating the pandemic, our camp community has joyfully reunited in person at camp. To ease the transition from virtual experiences to real-life interactions at camp, we’ve expanded our team of *Yoatzim* (staff advisors) and made investments to support the mental, emotional and social health of the entire camp population. In pre-season sessions, during staff week, and throughout the summer our staff members are gaining skills needed to be sensitive to our campers’ needs, which undoubtedly have been affected by changes to school and social environments.

Many staff members opted-in to virtual staff training opportunities this spring: a four-session seminar promoting diversity, equity and inclusion was led by the Jewish Council on Urban Affairs and a leadership development course was presented as part of the Nachshon Counselor Fellowship.

At least one staff member in each eidah has trained to be a *mini-medic* liaison to the camp infirmary. They’ve completed CPR and Red Cross First Aid courses and will be responsible for collecting the daily COVID-19 health screening data.

For the health and safety of our camp community, Camp Ramah in Wisconsin is operating in a bubble, with campers and staff remaining at camp with no summer visitors. So what about a day off for our staff? *Roshei Tzevet* (head staff) Melissa Levin and Tobiah Markovitz are coordinating a variety of programs to enhance staff life in the Mercaz Kopin staff lounge and in the new staff café in the Levine Seminar Center. Days off and evenings will include in-camp getaway spaces for streaming movies, evening campfires, and more.

We are thrilled to welcome our talented 2021 mishlachat - 45 Israeli staff members serving as cabin counselors and educators, and as waterfront, outdoor education, music, sports, and dance

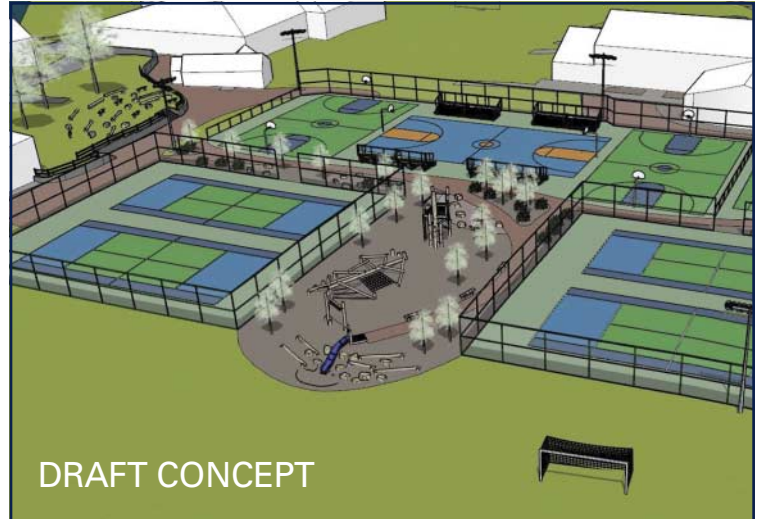

Introducing Shiluv – a new approach to inclusion

Since 1973, Camp Ramah in Wisconsin has been proud to welcome campers with unique challenges and disabilities as part of our inclusion and special needs programs including Tikvah and Atzmayim. This summer we are piloting a new approach to inclusion known as *Shiluv*, (integration) developed in recent years in ongoing dialogue with camper families and experts in special education. Campers previously in the Tikvah program now live with their age group peers and spend most of their day in eidah activities. The *Shiluv* approach both enhances our camp community and significantly diminishes the identity of Tikvah as a separate eidah.

As in previous summers, our Atzmayim vocational participants, high school graduates ages 18-21, are working five mornings a week at a variety of job sites with the guidance of job coaches. What's different this year - since camp is operating in a "bubble" per COVID-19 protocols - is that our ten Atzmayim are working in camp rather than in the local Eagle River community. Job assignments include the camp kitchen, office, laundry, woodworking shop, and the new staff café. Todah Rabbah to our Atzmayim for all their help to keep operations running smoothly in this unique season.
