4. Development Updates

Key Updates:

- o Tamar (in Osaka) tapped by Chicago Mayor to chair a Sister City initiative.
- \$100K raised since pre-read, including \$50K from Dr. Betsy Gidwitz for foreign camper travel expense.

Ongoing Campaigns:

- Tu B'Shvat Card: Sent to Legacy Society members and major donors.
- Strategic Plan Conversations: Outreach to key donors for planning over five years.

Comprehensive Campaign (2025-2029):

- Seeking campaign leadership.
- Board encouraged to set placeholder 5-year giving figures.

- Sam available to discuss donation allocations.
- Honor roll finalized after Pesach; essential for fundraising momentum.
- Guesthouse Naming Opportunity: \$100K for 13 guest rooms.

Upcoming Reunions & Alumni Initiatives:

- o Summer reunions planned, hoping to use some of new guest house facility.
- o Alumni Camp extended (Aug 8-11) response to feedback.
- Hoping to move Alumni impact campaign to November.

5. Summer Staffing

RDC:

- Good shape; still need:
 - 1:1 staff for kids with special needs.
 - Nurse, Travel Coordinator, Rosh Mitbachon.
- o Fully staffed with Shlichim.
- o Adie, Adina & Tali D. heading to Israel next week for staff training.

• CRW:

- Senior staff nearly full, high 2023→2024 retention.
- Staffing challenges:
 - Many going to Israel, some staff only available for one month.
 - Need more female hevratim.
 - Yahadut staff stretched thin.
 - Nurses & doctors needed (Robin leading nurse hires).
 - Rosh Chadar Alef supervision role needs filling.
 - Risk of Israeli staff dropping in April/May without replacements.
- Recruitment Plan: Outreach through networks; info on Rashei Eidah will be shared.

6. Lieberman Building Update

Delays Due to Permitting & Infrastructure Issues:

- Missed foundation laying before winter due to permitting delays and sewage/electric issues.
- o Outside GC (Mosaic) engaged to oversee project.
- Budget increased to cover additional costs.

Construction Timeline:

- Load limits recently enforced; lighter work continues until April-end.
- Hoping for partial completion by July for reunions.
- Site will not be open during camp, ensuring safety.
- Parent Communication: Need to reassure families about construction.

7. Budget, Enrollment & Scholarships

Tuition Collection:

- On track for \$3M by end of March (Q2).
- Goal to collect 90-95% of tuition before camp starts.

• Scholarships:

- Numbers increasing but within budgeted range.
- Some families need more assistance yearly.
- o Proposed **Scholarship Committee** (lay & professional leadership) to:
 - Determine allocation process.
 - Guide families toward external tuition assistance.
- Comparison to last year:
 - 2023: \$450K at CRW, ~\$100-110K at RDC.
 - 2024: Expected slight increase.
 - Tuition increases impacting some families.
 - Need to assess % of American campers on scholarships & average aid amount.
- **Budget:** On track with last year's CRW revenue.

8. Director of Camp Wellness & Inclusion

Hiring Update:

- Top candidate in negotiations.
- o Adina will supervise.
- Selected candidate will manage the team rather than handle crises directly.
